## Drilling Wells in the Desert



Love Mercy and God-TV have joined together to drill wells in the desert area of West Pokot, Kenya. Mary and I attended this drilling which was aird live on God-TV worldwide. The drilling of these wells is beginning to open doors for the preaching of the gospel in this area.

During this drilling we meet with the Senior Chief of this area. He is over 98,000 people, and he invited us to come and start churches in his district. We felt to begin by starting a place of prayer to help bring about unity in the area. Around eight pastors and leaders attended our meeting for unity and prayers for the region.

The first night we slept on the ground, but on our second trip we had this tent which we left as a place of prayer.

## Widow's Farming Project



Widows being trained in double digging and drip irrigation techniques.



We encourage local christians to assist and help us to reduce labor costs.

The project is targeted for widows who have been chosen by their pastors and are faithful Christians. They also need to have at least a quarter of an acre of land which is located near a year round source of water.

The local church is to provide labor and manure for the project. We in turn provide the equipment for the drip irrigation and training in intensive farming.

With this project, the widow should be able to have food year around as well as extra to sell to help her with other needs.

The cost for this project is around \$650 per widow.
